

Health Information Exchanges

Allergy Partners participates in health information exchanges (HIEs) in certain states, which allows your health care information to be securely shared between your physicians, hospitals, and other providers who help manage your health. Through our connection to the HIE, our providers will be able to see records of past care you received by other providers, which will allow our providers to make more informed decisions about care plans and avoid duplicative or unnecessary treatment. This replaces the more cumbersome requirement of faxing or physically transporting paper medical records between your providers.

You do not have to participate in an HIE to receive care from us. Opting out of a HIE does not stop us from using or sharing your information as described in our Notice of Privacy Practices. Visit the HIE sites listed to learn more about how they share your information and how to opt out of the HIE and re-engage in the HIE if you later decide you want to re-engage in the HIE.
